- 5. What are some ways you can help people learn to be more accepting and understanding of others?

- 1. What do you think explains The Bermuda Triangle?
- 2.Do you think aliens and UFOs exist?
- 3.Do you have any urban legends in your community?

#### IN THE CLASSROOM:
